Ivanhoe Junior Football Club Privacy Statement

The importance of privacy:

Ivanhoe Junior Football Club (IJFC) recognises that privacy is important. IJFC is committed to ensuring that personal or health information is collected, stored and used only in accordance with relevant privacy laws such as the Privacy Act 1988 (Commonwealth) and the Health Records Act 2001 (Victoria).

Collection of Personal Information and Health Information:

IJFC collects personal information (names, addresses, date of birth) on a voluntary basis for the primary purpose of holding records of its membership and, in particular, records about juniors who play for the club and their parents. These persons are the vast majority of the IJFC membership. Ivanhoe JFC maintains a mailing list that is used so the club can distribute information to members on key operations such as training, games, club functions, etc. Also, IJFC collects health information from its player

members relating to treating and recording football injuries and any pre-existing medical conditions.

Player membership information and health information is given to the Yarra Junior Football League (YJFL) if IJFC players are selected to represent the YJFL and when games are to be played interstate.

Security of Information:

IJFC takes all reasonable steps to protect the personal information and the health information that it holds from misuse and loss, and from unauthorised access, modification or disclosure.

Right to Access Information:

You have a right to access any information that the IJFC holds about you. If the information is not accurate, complete and up to date, you can ask us to modify our records.
